



Summer Camp Healthcare

- We follow local and state guidelines related to best practices for healthcare and safety of our campers and staff. Per these guidelines we adhere to many policies and practices related to care for camper and staff illness as well as the protections of others. We are working with healthcare professionals to revise our healthcare and infectious disease policies in light of the new concerns over COVID-19.
- Bethelwoods hires a licensed nurse to be on staff during the summer. The Camp Nurse is on site every day and is responsible for attending to and monitoring the health of campers and staff.
- Each camper receives a health screening upon arrival to camp. Any campers displaying signs of sickness will not be allowed to stay at camp.
- Our staff are first-aid and CPR certified. They also receive training on how to help campers avoid contact with germs, from good hygiene practices to frequent hand washing.
- All procedures and products used to clean our buildings meet CDC guidelines. We have also instituted stricter guidelines on what surfaces will be sanitized and how often.
- Our food service follows the guidelines of SCDHEC. We have retrained staff in areas of sanitation that are most important to stop the spread of disease.
